- Second in FIA Drivers' Championship
- Winner Chinese Grand Prix
- Winner British Grand Prix
- Winner Japanese Grand Prix
- Winner Abu Dhabi Grand Prix
- Four additional podium finishes
- Scores 84 points

**2008: Scuderia Toro Rosso – Formula One Driver**

- Winner Italian Grand Prix (youngest ever F1 winner)
- Pole position Italian Grand Prix (youngest ever F1 pole)
- Scores 35 points

**2007: BMW and Scuderia Toro Rosso – Formula One Driver**

- Competes in US Grand Prix for the BMW Sauber F1 Team
- Finishes eighth to score first point (youngest ever F1 point-scorer)
- Hungarian Grand Prix – joins Scuderia Toro Rosso
- Scores six points

**2006: Formula 3 Euro and Formula One Test Driver (BMW Sauber)**

- Second place Formula 3 Euro Series, four wins
- WSR FR3.5, three races, two wins
- Formula One tests with BMW Sauber F1 in Jerez and Monza
- Friday test and reserve driver for the BMW Sauber F1 Team from the Turkish Grand Prix onwards

**2005: Formula 3 Euro**

- Fifth place Formula 3 Euro Series
- Rookie champion, 6 podium places
- Formula One test with BMW Williams in Jerez

**2004: Formula BMW ADAC**

- Winner Formula BMW ADAC Championship
- 18 wins from 20 races, 14 pole positions
- 13 fastest race laps

**2003: Formula BMW ADAC**

- Second place Formula BMW ADAC Championship, five wins
- Rookie champion

**2002: Karting**

- Sixth place European Championship ICA Senior
